## The "Ideal" Family, A Holy Family

Dear Friends,

I hope this newsletter finds you and yours in good health and spirits.

A few weeks before Christmas, I was overwhelmed by the functional ministry of our church. This led me to work extra hours, sleep poorly, and be a little grumpy.

I cried out to God, Help me. Immediately I recalled an image of the holy family by artist Janet McKenzie. I went into my office and found her book *Holiness & the Feminine Spirit*, which I bought years ago at a clergy retreat led by Janet in the Diocese of Massachusetts. Her paintings are spellbinding to me. I wrote to her and received permission to photocopy this image from the book, a canvas titled *The Holy Family*.

Take a moment to absorb the image. Really look at it. What do you notice? Some people will be struck by the faces of the family. In an accompanying reflection, Wendy Beckett writes: "The people in McKenzie's *The Holy Family* are not Palestinian. She shows us a group of poor people who have the unmistakable features of African or perhaps the Mexican or Peruvian."

Look at the image again, and you will see Joseph's "sturdy shoulders, his lack of interest in anything but the mother and child." See how tenderly his strong hands touch Mary's veil. Notice the warmth of the family and the colors—the halos are not gold, but purple. Notice the child Jesus, innocent and curious, snugly and warm, untroubled by threats.



Too often throughout the world, fathers are overanxious or absent, mothers are exhausted or overwhelmed, and children scream or struggle to suckle, to cling to life. What else do you see?

Now, notice their eyes. Joseph's and Mary's eyes are closed, as if they are listening to "Silent Night" sung a cappella

by candlelight. A peaceful calm breathes upon you. And then you see Jesus's eyes, looking right at you—into your heart and soul—all knowing, all loving, calling you into deeper relationship with him, in service to others.

Janet McKenzie gives us the image (next page) of the "ideal" family, a holy family—what the body of Christ can be when we submit to God's radical love for all people.



# Campus Security Upgrade Planned with FEMA Grant

Our parish campus welcomes all, without exceptions. Now, thanks to a competitive \$100,000 Nonprofit Security Grant Program grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) awarded to St. Bart's, our campus will be safer and more secure for parishioners and visitors alike.

The FEMA award will be available starting mid-2020 to address vulnerabilities identified by the San Diego Law Enforcement Coordination Center. A group of parishioners worked on the grant application with Senior Warden Jim Macemon. Highlights of the planned additions and upgrades include:

- Purchase and install an integrated system of cameras, sensors, lighting and communications systems that can aid in detecting and monitoring suspicious persons entering the campus. Right now we don't have the ability to see all parts of our campus. In the preschool there is no ability for teachers and staff to easily communicate between classrooms. New systems will address both those needs.
- Develop emergency action plans and security plans for clergy, staff and volunteers and those who regularly use the campus. The grant will also be used for training in how to handle security emergencies for all clergy and staff.
- New locks and entry systems for the main doors of campus buildings. This modern system will use key cards to control physical access to buildings and the preschool, replacing the keys that have been widely distributed over the years.
- New LED lighting in the lower parking lots and walkways.

The FEMA grant funds address the first phase of \$400,000 in suggested security improvements.

In October, the State of California announced a similar competitive \$200,000 grant. Our application was submitted earlier this month and the awards will be announced in January. If received, these additional funds will extend emergency communication throughout the campus, improve patio, upper parking and walkway lighting, update all old/narrow Sanctuary doors to ADA compliance, and install shatterproof glass in all ground floor windows. Please keep our application in your prayers.

All work (FEMA Grant & God willing the State of California Grant) will be realized incrementally, and we anticipate most of

it to be completed over the first 12 months of receiving funding from either grant.

While this will make our church a safer place, most of these improvements will not be noticed on a day to day basis (the exception being outdoor lighting). We are striving to create a secure environment that still welcomes all, safely and with open arms.

# Come Support St. Bart's Children's Choir

As you may know, St. Bartholomew's has had a long tradition of children participating in our music ministry, and 2019-20 began the re-vamp of our choir school program, with a wonderful boost in attendance and interest. The chorister program (ages 6-13) now has 18 singers, and they sing monthly at the 10:15 service, on the first Sunday of the month. They also sang at our All Saints' Day Celebration, our December Festival of Lessons and Carols, and will present their very own **Chorister Evensong Service on Sunday, February 9, at 4 p.m.**



This is a tremendous accomplishment for the children, some of which only started singing and learning music for the first time in September. They will lead us in the beautiful liturgy of Evening Prayer, supplemented with adult voices for the remaining choral parts, singing gorgeous music from traditional favorites to newer compositions.

Evensong is based on the monastic offices of prayer of the medieval church— a combined service of the evening office of Vespers and the nighttime office of Compline— and was incorporated into the first Book of Common Prayer in 1549. Today Evensong is celebrated around the world as a beautiful, contemplative service marking the end of the day and filled with music and prayer, often in the language of those early prayer books.

I hope to see you there to support our budding musicians and many thanks in advance for your continued support of the St. Bartholomew's Music Ministry.

# Revelation Bible Study Course

*The Rev. William Zettinger*

Revelation (known as the Apocalypse or insight) is one of the most engaging and disputed books of the Bible. It has inspired great works of art and music, and it has fed social upheaval and speculation about the coming end of the world. This course will ask what Revelation is, why it has played such a volatile role in Western culture, and how it continues to be meaningful to contemporary readers.

The first part of the course places Revelation in context by exploring the intellectual and social currents that lie behind it.

The second part of the course provides an overview of Revelation's images of the four horsemen, the red dragon, and the seven-headed beast. As we get a vivid sense of the struggle of God versus evil, we can see that Revelation offers a compelling vision of hope.



The third part traces the impact Revelation has had on Western history. We explore the idea of the Antichrist and the 1,000-year period of peace on earth. We explore the reasons that Revelation was included in the New Testament when other apocalyptic texts were not. We trace the way Revelation was used in conflicts among popes, emperors, and church reformers. We explore why some religious groups have used Revelation to set the dates for the end of the world, while others have used it as a call for a better society. Finally, we turn to the modern interest in Revelation (and other apocalyptic literature) and its significance for readers today.




