- Experience implementing policies and/or systems to keep children and youth safe.
- College education preferred.

- 3-5 years of experience teaching in Sunday school or children's classrooms.
- Training in Godly Play or Catechism of the Good Shepherd preferred.
- Church school or professional teaching training preferred.
- Highly organized.
- Excellent communication skills.
- Enjoys problem solving.
- Natural motivator of others and advocate for collaborative/cooperative leadership.
- Proven team player.
- Easter attitude!

## Specific Responsibilities (subject to change)

- Responsible for assisting the Assistant Rector in the implementation of children's ministry programming.
- Responsible for implementing mission and vision of the parish, as understood in our strategic plan and annual goals.
- Responsible for maintaining and enabling a safe, welcoming campus to all.
- Director of year-round Sunday school programming for children (newborns through 5<sup>th</sup> graders).
- Coordinate and support new initiatives, for example, to offer formation opportunities on Wednesday afternoons, etc.
- Active and tangible ministry of presence: be present and visible during program hours and parish events.
- Work closely with faith formation team (lay leaders, staff, and clergy).
- Promote and implement the policies and practices of the Episcopal Church, the Rector, and people of St. Bartholomew's Episcopal Church.
- Integrate principle teachings and programs of the parish into the lives of children (on and off campus) in tangible ways.
- Maintain and implement registration and record keeping, including tracking attendance, notifying the ministry team of newcomers, illnesses, and unusual absences.
- Manage and maintain an inventory of school and children's ministry supplies, curriculum, etc.
- Recruit, support, and participate in the training and ongoing formation of teachers and aides.
- Invite and lead parents and grandparents to deepen faith formation at home.
- Advocate for the voice and presence of children in the life of the church.
- Proactively engage pastoral matters with clergy.
- Develop and expand our ability to create joyful, colorful, learning environments.

## Sunday Mornings:

- Anticipate and have all teachers, aides, and classrooms prepared before the team arrives.
- Ensure all greetings, welcoming, and new family systems signage is out and awaiting people's arrival.
- On Sunday mornings, ensure children are ready to enter church after the peace and remain with them at altar rail until dismissed (as applicable).
- Be available to assist and coordinate special events, such as Vacation Bible School, Lenten University, Mother's Day Tea, Trunk or Treat, Kid's Night Out, etc.
- Work in collaboration with and develop team relationship with Sunday School volunteers, Youth Minister, other CFF staff, parish administrator, and clergy.
- Participate in Children's Formation parent meetings, parent and teacher retreats, etc.
- Attend staff meetings weekly unless otherwise negotiated (Tuesdays, 12:00 1:30 p.m.). In addition, attend CFF planning and CFF leadership meetings as negotiated.
- Coordinate and facilitate the preparation, scheduling, and implementation of preschool chapel time (as applicable).
- Assist Children's Chapel team leaders.
- Ensure all rooms are clean, organized, and materials are put away after each use.
- Greet families on the patio, participate in guiding children and families to classrooms, walk through classrooms and hallways during class time, and be prepared to assist teachers.
- Assistant care for children in worship services.
- Active presence each Sunday in worship, in classrooms, and on the patio.
- Maintain an active faith in Jesus Christ.
- Communicate effectively and pro-actively to the parish, parents, and teachers through all current and future tools (newsletter, e-news, constant contact, Facebook posts, etc.).
- Maintain pastoral boundaries.
- Other tasks as assigned by the Rector.
