ASSIGNMENT OPTIONS

I. Choose a reading & respond to it. Consider Lyon's role at the forefront of American documentary style photography. How did his style influence today's photography? Consider using examples of his work in your response.

2. How did Lyon's ability to immerse himself with his subjects inform his photography? Provide an example of his work which illustrates your points.

3. Spend some time this week taking 3 to 5 photographs that follow Lyon's style of immersing yourself in your subject matter. Consider photographing things across a variety of themes—from simply, daily life to social causes. Give each work a title & try to share an artist statement which explains your creative vision. "The most unsafe place to be, whether people are using rocks or bullets, is between the lines. You must choose a side, if for no other reason than to have a firm spot on which to stand and a moment's peace to focus."
